The TRANSLATION RESEARCH SUMMER SCHOOL is run by the Centre for Translation and Intercultural Studies at the University of Manchester, the Centre for Intercultural Studies at University College London (UCL), and the Translation Studies Graduate Programme, School of Literatures, Languages and Cultures, University of Edinburgh.



ABOUT THE COURSE

The two-week course is split into four modules:

- Theoretical Approaches to Translation Studies
- Research Methods in Translation Studies
- Research Design & Dynamics
- Specialist Module for 2010: Translation and Value



Each module includes six contact hours and approximately six hours of guided reading. You will spend your mornings in classes and workshops while afternoons are spent in tutorials and independent study. At the end of the course you will have the chance to present your work to students and staff. Assessment is based on your oral presentation and a 3000-4000 word research proposal.

The sessions are run by expert academics in the field of translation and interpreting studies, principally from the participating universities, as well as an internationally-renowned guest speaker.

The Summer School is open to students from across the world. Candidates should hold the degree of Master of Arts or equivalent in a relevant subject. You should be proficient in English and have started or be actively considering research in translation and/or interpreting studies.

The cost of the two-week course is £975 (for students funded by an institution) or £680 (for self-funded students).
